Carol Maanyatja Golding wurde beim Walu-Felsloch geboren. Dieses liegt zwischen Warakurna und Papulankutja in der östlichen Gibson Desert in Western Australia. Als junges Kind durchlief sie das Sandhügel (tali)-Gebiet zwischen dem Land ihres Vaters im Süden in der Nähe von Papulankutja und dem Land ihrer Mutter in der Nähe von Warakurna. Noch in jungen Jahren verwaiste sie und wurde von der Familie Hooper, den Eltern von Rachel Jennings und Eunice Porter, aufgenommen. Carol hatte mit ihrem Mann zusammen viele Kinder und ließ sich schließlich in Warakurna, dem Land ihrer Mutter, nieder.

Früher malte Carol beim Warburton Arts Project, begann jedoch Mitte 2005 bei den Warakurna Artists zu malen. Sehr schnell entwickelte sie zu einer der führenden seniores Künstlerinnen des Kunstzentrums. Carol malt überwiegend eine wichtige Ngaanyatjarra-Geschichte von ihrem Geburtsort Walu.
