

LIDDY WALKER NAPANANGKA

Sprache: Warlpiri
Region: Yuendumu, Northern Territory
Geboren: ca. 1925



Liddy Walker Napanangka wurde in Mt. Doreen geboren und lebte während ihrer frühen Kindheit mit ihrer Familie in Buschlagern. Sie lebt in Yuendumu in der Warlpiri Gemeinde in der Tanami Wüste, 300 km nordwestlich von Alice Springs, seit diese gegründet wurde. Dort war sie als Viehhüterin sowie als Köchin tätig.

Sie sagt über sich: "Ich male das Japangardi Dreaming meines Vaters und das Dreaming meines Großvaters. Mt. Theo ist das Land meines Vaters und von dort kommen auch meine Dreamings. Die Dreamings, die ich male, sind Buschtomate, Goanna [Waran].... Waran kämpft gern und ist ein „lover boy“. Und ich male Samenhülsen und Buschkartoffel und Springmaus. Es gibt eine Menge Geschichten ...Ich male viel.“

Liddy begann zu malen kurz nachdem Warlukurlangu Artists Aboriginal Association gegründet wurde – ca. Mitte der 80er Jahre - und ist jetzt eine der senioren Mitglieder. Sie besucht regelmäßig ihr Land um Mt. Theo, westlich von Yuendumu.

Liddys Gemälde befinden sich in wichtigen öffentlichen Sammlungen wie z. B. der Nationalgalerie Australiens und werden mit großem Erfolg in Ausstellungen – auch außerhalb Australiens - gezeigt.
